Ceres Solutions is offering 10/ \$1000 scholarships to high school seniors to help further their education. The Elks National Foundation:2020 Most Valuable Student Scholarship contest!

Applications are due online by **November 5, 2019**.

The top 20 MVS finalists will attend the Most Valuable Student Leadership Weekend from April 23-26, 2020, in Chicago to interview for the top awards of \$50,000, \$40,000 and \$30,000. The remaining 14 finalists will receive \$20,000 each. 480 other deserving national finalists will receive \$4,000 scholarships to support their college education.

Civil Engineering Scholarship:

The Indiana Department of Transportation (INDOT) is offering students going into civil engineering, scholarships up to \$3,125 per semester, and paid employment on summer breaks and upon graduation. This scholarship is renewable up to 5 years. Scholarship funds can be applied to educational expenses, fees and books. In return, recipients will work for INDOT in full time, paid positions as stated above.

Qualifications to apply and deadlines:

* Student must be accepted or enrolled full time in one of Indiana's civil engineering schools. Eligible Programs include: (Purdue University Fort Wayne, Purdue University, Rose-Hulman, Trine University, Purdue University Northwest, University of Evansville, University of Notre Dame, and Valparaiso University)

* Applications for the 2020-2021 school year must be submitted by **Tuesday, December 31, 2019**.
