One of the goals of the Vincennes University Mathematics Education program is for our preservice teachers and program graduates to become reflective practitioners. Application deadline for the Mathematics Education Program Scholarships for the 2021-2022 academic year is March 31, 2021. Winners will be notified by April 15, 2021. Scholarships are awarded for one academic year and are non-renewable. Scholarships are not based on financial need. Scholarship winners must have applied and been accepted to Vincennes University.
