# MINUTES OF MEETING OF BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF CLAY COMMUNITY SCHOOLS

A regular session meeting of the Clay Community Schools Board of Trustees was held at the Central Administrative Office, 1013 S. Forest Avenue, Brazil, IN 47834, on Thursday, September 12, 2019. Kevin Kumpf, Michael Shaw, Lynn Romas, Andrea Baysinger, Tom Reberger, and Charley Jackson were present. Amy Burke Adams was absent.

Prior to the Call to Order, a bid opening for interior doors at Clay City Jr/Sr High School and Northview High School was conducted. One bid was received, from Garmong Construction. The amount of the bid was \$659,000 for 253 doors at Northview and \$315,000 for 146 doors at Clay City. The bids are to be taken under advisement.

#### V. Superintendent's Report

Superintendent Fritz noted the following:

- New hires Fawn Zimmerman, Sandra Clevenger, Ashley Brown, Terry Tincher, Amanda Moore, Emily Turpen, Austin Graham, Alice Fulk, Penny Hood, Paula Nichols, Marcy Young, Natasha Morris, Rebecca Miller, Leslie Douglas, Amanda Medcalf, Mavery Brush, Staci Schafer, and Sara Meyerholtz were welcomed to the school family.
- The budget hearing for the 2020 budget is to be held during a special session on September 25.
- Congratulations were offered to Clay City Jr/Sr High School for receiving the IHSAA Sportsmanship award. Superintendent Fritz read part of a letter from IHSAA Commissioner Bobby Cox in which Commissioner Cox noted that of the 410 eligible high schools in the state, just 17 qualified for this extremely prestigious award for the 2018-19 school year. It was Superintendent Fritz's understanding that this was the fifth consecutive year for Clay City to receive this award, and there are only five schools in the state that have received this award in five consecutive years.

#### VI. New Business

# A. Request Permission to Advertise for Bids to Renovate Restrooms at Clay City High School

Dr. Shaw moved to approve the request for permission to advertise for restroom renovations at Clay City High School. Mrs. Baysinger seconded, and the motion was approved by a 6-0 vote.

## B. Request to Accept Donation of \$25,000 from Brian Dorsett and Dorsett Mitsubishi for Northview High School

Mr. Jackson moved to approve the recommendation to accept a donation of \$25,000 to Northview High School from Brian Dorsett and Dorsett Mitsubishi for advertising space on the scoreboard of the football field. Dr. Shaw seconded, and the motion was approved by a 6-0 vote.

#### C. Athletic Directors Presentation

Mr. Shane Reese, the athletic director/assistant principal for Clay City Jr/Sr High School, shared information regarding the role athletics plays in character building, leadership, and sportsmanship at Clay City. He noted that from 2014-2017 the school had been fortunate to qualify for the IHSAA/NAIA Champion of Character Five-Star School Leadership Program award. Since 2017, when the IHSAA formed their own sportsmanship award, the following criteria are to be met in order to qualify for the IHSAA award: 1) A score of 100+ must be met; 2) Leadership roles must be offered through implementation of an athletic council; 3) the merit of service leadership is to be

acknowledged with a student leadership committee; 4) educational programs are to be provided for coaches and students; and 5) participation in an annual sportsmanship conference is required. Mr. Reese concluded his remarks by thanking the school board and the administration for everything that had been done to the sports facilities, including the new track, the baseball diamond, the softball diamond, the auxiliary "Barn", and the Eel Dome. He deemed them to be great facilities; they love them, and they are proud of them.

Mr. Scott Buell, the boys athletic director for Northview High School and North Clay Middle School, opened his presentation by thanking the school board, Mr. Fritz, and Central Office staff for the renovations, addition, and new builds; they are truly grateful for all of the improvements. He and Mrs. Bethany Jones, the girls athletic director for Northview High School and North Clay Middle School, then offered a PowerPoint presentation regarding some of the programs being utilized for student athletes, including the Inside Out initiative, the Character Development and Leadership app, and the Champions Together program.

#### D. CCHS & NHS Promotional Videos

Professional videos had recently been developed to promote both of the high schools, and additional videos are planned that will highlight the other schools. The CCHS and NHS videos were shown to help make the Board and community aware of some of the promotional efforts.

#### VII. <u>Board Member Comments</u>

**Kevin Kumpf** shared Mr. Reberger's often-repeated comment that there were a lot of great things happening in Clay Community Schools, and he was glad to be a part of it. **Michael Shaw** echoed Mr. Kumpf's comment.

**Lynn Romas** stated that he had been very impressed with the athletic directors and the programs they are starting. He noted that he had heard nothing but good things about the new football field. He thanked Knust Excavating for their work on the field.

Andrea Baysinger agreed it was all good.

**Charley Jackson** congratulated Clay City for the sportsmanship award. He also congratulated the new hires for Clay Community Schools. He offered his thanks to Brian Dorsett for his donation. Mr. Jackson concluded his comments by thanking the Clay City and Northview athletic directors for their great presentations.

**Tom Reberger** shared that he was very proud of Clay City for winning the sportsmanship award.
