





Reading Foundational Skills

- 1.RF.4.1: We know what sound(s) each letter in the alphabet makes. We know that some letters are blended together to make new sounds (sh, ay, wr, tion, oo, etc.) We can read and write these "hunks and chunks."
- 1.RF.5: We can read a first grade text or story aloud smoothly and accurately.

- 1.CA.6 We know that the = sign acts as a balance and we can tell if problems are TRUE or FALSE. (4+2=6 [true]; 5=2+1 [false])
