Service

- Works well with others
- Willingly takes on difficult or inconspicuous responsibilities
- Participates in some activity outside of school (e.g. church groups, volunteer services for the elderly or disadvantaged, mission trips, etc.)

Character

- Consistently exemplifies positive and desirable qualities of behavior:
 - Respectfulness
 - Honesty
 - Academic integrity
 - Courtesy
 - Cheerfulness/friendliness
 - Poise
 - School spirit
 - Motivation
 - Loyalty

- Cooperates by complying with all school policies and regulations and codes of student conduct
