Thursday, January 16, 2025

DROP-OFF/PICK-UP: Lower-Level Union West, Green Room, Building 2

PHARMACY: Students will discuss the field of Pharmacy including the education requirements and daily tasks of a hospital pharmacist.

Thursday, February 6, 2025 (6:00 pm – 7:30 pm)

DROP-OFF/PICK-UP: Lower Level, Bone and Joint, Building 9, 1725 N. 5th Street, Terre Haute, IN 47804.

OUTPATIENT THERAPY: Students will be introduced to Union Hospital Outpatient Therapy which includes the services of Physical Therapy, Occupational Therapy, Speech Therapy, and Sports Medicine.

Thursday, February 20, 2025

DROP-OFF/PICK-UP: Auditorium, Landsbaum Center for Health Education, 1433 N. 6 ½ Street, Terre Haute, IN 47807.

BEHAVIORAL HEALTH: Students will learn about the robust field of behavioral health and the increasing need for professionals in the field. They will discuss the various training paths that lead into the profession in addition to the wide array of jobs within that specialty.

Thursday, March 6, 2025

DROP-OFF/PICK-UP: Union West, Simulation Center, Building 2

RESPIRATORY THERAPY: Students will gain an in-depth understanding of how the lungs exchange oxygen with the blood and how lung disease can affect this process. Gloves will be required as students will be exploring the trachea (windpipe) and lungs of a cow. The adult ventilator (breathing machine) will be attached to the lungs to demonstrate how the lungs respond to ventilator changes.

Thursday, March 20, 2025

DROP-OFF/PICK-UP: Lower-Level Union East, Atrium Conference Room, Building 1

NURSING: During this program, students will discover the various opportunities that a career in nursing offers. They will gain an understanding of the training required, skills needed, and typical roles and responsibilities of a nurse in a hospital setting.

Thursday, April 10, 2025

DROP-OFF/PICK-UP: Union West, Lower Level, Green Room, Building 2

CARDIAC CATHETERIZATION (CATH) LAB: While visiting the Cath Lab suites, students will learn about the role of a cardiac specialist and become familiar with the equipment and technology that is utilized in the care and treatment of Cath Lab patients.

Wednesday, April 23, 2025

DROP-OFF/PICK-UP: Lower-Level Union East, Atrium Conference Room, Building 1

IMAGING SERVICES: Students will tour each modality of Imaging Services (X-ray, CT, MRI, Ultrasound, and Diagnostic Procedures) and learn how imaging saves lives. They will understand the basic principles of each modality, along with other advanced technology offered by the department. Staff will demonstrate skills and the use of the equipment as well as share a sampling of images with the students.
