Literacy/Language Arts

Fill in the missing letter 5 minutes

If you have a printer, print the second page of this document. If you do not have a printer, just have students look at it on the screen. Have them point to every letter as they say it. When they come to a blank space, have them tell you what letter goes in the blank. If you can't print the WS just let them write the letter on a separate sheet of paper.

Have students practice singing their Days of the week. They should be able to sing them correctly for you by this point in the year, but if they need help you can listen to this song as a reminder.

Making Shapes 8-10 minutes

Let your child use items around the house to practice making shapes with straight sides. Some things you might use are toothpicks, Q-tips, straws, pens or pencils, popsicle sticks or just cutting out small strips of paper that are the same length. Then have them put the item you choose together as a square, rectangle, triangle, diamond, hexagon, or octagon. This would be a great time to talk about why you cannot make a circle or an oval helping them think about round vs. straight sides on shapes.
