Parents, I tried my best to put these activities together so that you can do these activities at home with your child with things you have around the house. Literacy/Language Arts

Fact or Fiction is probably too hard for preschool.

Writing Prompt **10 minutes**

Help students read the sentence starter on the next page. If you don’t have a printer, write the sentence starter for them. Then talk with them about what they are missing most from school. Write what they wrote on a separate piece of paper. They should copy/write their answer on their paper. Then have them draw a picture of what they wrote about.

This is a very simple game comparing height, length, weight and capacity. You can read the question to your child or there is a speaker on the screen that will read the question to the students. If you are unable to do the game online, you could find some items around your house and ask your child to pick which item is longer/taller or shorter, bigger or smaller, heavier or lighter, or which holds more or less.


Naming Shapes
