Dear Parents,

Spring Break has come and gone! I am hopeful that everyone took time to relax and have recharged those batteries to prepare for the fourth and final grading period of school year. As I am writing this, I am reminded that we didn't have a Spring Break last year because of the onset of the pandemic. What a year it has been! I am thankful that we have been in school since August – only shutting down for a brief period before Christmas because of Covid-19 related issues in the corporation. I am hopeful that Clay County will continue to progress towards "normal" and that there will be an end to all of this soon.

Before Spring Break, third grade students' reading skills were assessed with the state required assessment call IREAD-3. Preliminary results indicate that our students have done pretty well. Later in April, we begin our final round of standardized testing with the IREADY Spring Assessment. Our third, fourth, and fifth grade students will also begin taking the Indiana assessment called ILEARN. Data from these assessments helps teachers evaluate teaching strategies, develop lesson plans, and enable teachers to better meet the needs of all of our students. These test results are also helpful in determining student growth, skill levels, and overall achievement. I encourage you to spend some time reviewing skills with your child and stress the importance of doing his or her best on the test.

In closing, I want to extend gratitude to all for staying the course with us as a school and as a school corporation. The pandemic has impacted all levels of life as we know it. In spite of this, the dedication of our school family has proven successful this school year. We only have a few weeks to go until we can call it a year – a successful and full year of school!
