Physical books, especially those in genres like fiction and memoirs, allow readers to build empathy and emotional intelligence. They offer insights into different perspectives and life experiences, enabling individuals to develop stronger social and emotional connections with others. A study in the Science journal showed that reading fiction improved the ability to understand others' emotions, which is critical for building relationships.



In contrast, excessive screen time often encourages short, fragmented interactions that can hinder the development of deep, meaningful connections. Social media platforms, while connecting people globally, have also been shown to encourage superficial connections that lack depth, making it more challenging for individuals to develop long-term, fulfilling relationships.
